Bridging to Boy Scouts

Burnout No More!

Are there meetings where you feel more burned out than the logs after a campfire? Let's face it, Cub Scouts is a lot of work. And it gets more intense as the boys get bigger. Sure you can do more with them when they are older, but that requires more planning. The bigger boys start to feel too old for Cubs and that only compounds things. So where does that leave a leader? Often too close to burn out. Instead of going up in smoke, recharge the batteries and enjoy the ride. Soon your Cubs will be yours no more and off to Boy Scouts. If you find yourself burning out, what can you do? Ask for help!! I don't mean a shrink (apologies to

any psychiatrists in our midst!), I mean the parents in your Den, your Cubmaster, other leaders, etc. Ask parents with expertise in a particular area to help plan a meeting. Hold a meeting at another location like a museum or other place that can do the work for you. Ask leaders of older Dens how they did a requirement and borrow some of their resources. Put some old fashioned fun into the meeting. Do things with the boys that used to bring you satisfaction. Chances are it will for them as well. Keep it simple, doing things the Scouts enjoy - make a chalk board, tie knots, play games. Take some training, leaders share experiences in training and you can get new ideas. Feeling prepared and being trained builds confidence and fights burn out. So take a breath and take a break and remember that you are making a difference in the lives of the boys in your Den.

A big thank you to all who have come down and participated in this year's roundtable meetings.

Looking forward 2016 will bring some changes to the Boy Scout program. Some things to know:

Fall 2015 - New requirement information and interpretation shared via Advancement News, roundtables, etc

January 2016 - 2016 Boy Scout Requirements book released – 2016 Boy Scout Handbook released -

New requirements become effective

For 2016:

- Boys joining on or after Jan. 1, 2016 **MUST** use the new requirements.
- Boys who have joined prior to Jan. 1, 2016:
 - Who are working on the Scout badge **MAY** continue to work on the existing requirements, but **MUST** convert to the new requirements upon completion of the Scout badge.
 - Who are working on Tenderfoot through First Class **MAY** continue to work on the existing requirements, but **MUST** convert to the new requirements upon attaining First Class.
 - Who have completed First Class **MAY** complete the rank they are currently working on in the existing requirements, but then **MUST** convert to the new requirements for subsequent ranks.
 - For 2017: All Scouts **MUST** use the new requirements regardless of rank

Some previews:

NOT Changing

- Current ranks or approach (Tenderfoot-1st Class concurrent; Star-Eagle sequential)
- Use of merit badge program

CHANGING

- Scout becomes a rank
- Service @ all ranks (conservation related at Life)
- Health eating/habits
- Some reordering (Tenderfoot-1st Class)
- Physical fitness at each rank – Tenderfoot-1st Class
- Outdoor ethics – Leave No Trace & TL
- Weather safety, risk assessment & mitigation
- Duty to God incorporated in requirement to show Scout Spirit.
