Bridging to Boy Scouts

New “Big Dogs” of the Pack

Now that the Sr. Webelos, or Arrow of Light Scouts, have crossed over there is now only one Webelos Den and they are now the “big dogs” of the Pack. While they may be very excited about all of this, as their leader, the finish line is in sight and there is a lot to be done.

Decide soon if you will change to the new program or stay with the one in place. This last Webelos group can use the current program for next year. If you decide to change, start learning all you can about the new program.

Look at the Troops around your area. Reach out to the Scoutmasters and get to know about their units. Start talking to the parents and Webelos about the Boy Scout program and how it is run. Get them acclimated to the difference. Plan dates in the Fall to visit the local Troops.

Review your progress toward the “Arrow of Light.” Are you on track? Will your Den have completed what is needed by your crossing over? Start planning your final year and keep the parents informed about what is needed and when it can be done.

Check the boys progress and let parents know if the boy is falling behind so that they can make up the work rather than miss out on achieving the Arrow of Light.

Sometimes the program can feel repetitive. Look for new ways to fulfill requirements. The boys are bigger and older and they need the program to keep up with their age. Choose age appropriate activities that will keep these boys interested in their last year.

Other Venturing Updates:

As of March 1, any new Venturer who is registering and over 18 must:

1. Complete a BSA Youth application
2. Complete an adult application (Complying with BSA Membership Standards)
3. Complete Adult Youth Protection

If they are already 18, registered in a crew and not moving to a new crew... they are grandfathered in and no action is necessary. IF they move to a new crew, then they must complete the 3 steps above.
