Cub Scout Shooting Sports Awards

There are new awards for shooting sports in Cub Scouts. The three shooting sports are BB gun, archery and sling shot. Like the previous belt loops: “Cub Scout shooting sports programs may be conducted only on a district or council level. Archery, BB gun shooting, and slingshot shooting are restricted to day camps, Cub Scout/Webelos Scout resident camps, council-managed family camping programs, or to council activities where there are properly trained supervisors and all standards for BSA shooting sports are enforced.” Each of the three shooting sports awards have 2 levels. The first level is “Participation and Knowledge” and applies to all ranks. This is generally the safety and demo part of the award. The second part is the “Skill and Knowledge” section which is where the Scout has rank appropriate requirements in each sport. Level 1 and 2 must be completed for each sport. There is a patch by rank for completing Level 1 for the first sport chosen. When the second level is reached a pin for the specific sport is awarded. Completion of additional sports adds another pin. No doubt these awards will quickly become a favorite!

Bridging to Boy Scouts

Now What? What do you do when your meeting plans tank?

It has probably happened to everyone. You plan a meeting, all is ready to go and boom! your meeting falls apart. Your speaker doesn't show or cancels last minute and there you are with a room full of boys and nothing planned. No doubt this is the stuff of nightmares. But not all is lost – this is the “A Scout is Prepared” moment. Never underestimate the power of Plan B and we always need a Plan B. Even in the best of circumstances, people are late, things run short, etc. Be flexible and be prepared to change the schedule of events if someone is running behind. Grab another leader and brain storm what to do. Sometimes we overthink what we need to do to make the Scouts happy. Simple games, songs, cheers are often the stuff memories are made of. Always have a game, cheer, song or skit in your mind prior to a meeting. Giving the Scouts a few pipe cleaners with the challenge to make something is a great last minute activity. Pipe cleaners are inexpensive and easy to have around. If the weather is nice, keep a ball in your car for outside games if needed. Break the boys into groups and have them prepare a skit. Get input from the Scouts on what activities they would like to do at a meeting. Talk about camping and how to pack and prepare. A little extra effort will help you keep your cool when things don't go as planned.

High Adventure Resources:

Passport to High Adventure (No. 34245)

Passport to High Adventure is designed to help older Scouts, with guidance from their adult leaders, to plan and safely carry out council and unit high-adventure treks using 'leave no trace' techniques. Get your passport punched and ride your ticket to high adventure! A directory of fifty-five council high-adventure programs and seventeen specialty adventure programs is included. Learn what they provide and where to telephone or write for more information.

Powder Horn Training

The Powder Horn course is designed to help the troop, team, or crew by exposing older Scouts, Venturers, and adult leaders to safely conducted outdoor/high-adventure activities of a fun and challenging nature. The course provides an introduction to the resources needed to successfully lead youth through a program of outdoor adventure and is based upon giving participants an exposure to some outdoor/high-adventure activities. The course presenters are expert consultants, from inside and outside of Scouting, in each outdoor high adventure activity. It is not a certification event. It is for any youth or adult interested in experiencing a unit-level, high-adventure program.
